



The Epiphany of the Lord

Mission Statement

We, the people of St. Bavo Parish are committed to be the living presence of Christ in the world today.

Empowered by the Spirit, we strive to live our shared commitment through liturgical celebrations, prayer, education, spiritual growth, bearing witness to faith and service to all.



During this week between Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord, all thoughts of the baby Jesus are quickly left behind. The gospel readings, selected from the early chapters of all four gospels, recall the very beginnings of Jesus' public ministry, according to the four evangelists — Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Remember, these

authors were attempting to present Jesus *truthfully* to their readers, so that all could come to know Jesus as the Incarnate Son of God and believe in him. However, they were not terribly concerned about giving a *historically accurate* account of his activities. So, we should not be surprised that the order of events differs from one gospel to another, or that some of the stories which appear in multiple gospels are placed in different contexts and convey slightly different messages.

All the first readings for this week come from the First Letter of John. The Apostle recalls Jesus' commandment to his disciples to love one another as he loved them. And John assures the faithful that if they keep the Lord's commandments, then Christ will remain in them. His Spirit will help them to discern the truth and avoid getting confused by any false teachings. This is important, because Christ's disciples must live in the real world, with all its complexities and uncertainties. The Spirit will empower them not only to hold fast to the truth, but to profess it convincingly, so that others may be brought to the truth, as well.

John also explores the theme of God's love, looking at it from various angles. For example, he famously declares that "God is love." Hence, the one who does not love others does not know God. Recall how Jesus said that the commandments to love God with our whole being and to love our neighbors as ourselves are essentially two sides of the same coin. John would say that the reason these two commandments are inseparable is because God is the *source* of love. Hence, our love for God and our love for our neighbor are both a reflection of God's perfect love.

John emphasizes that God's love for us is unconditional and gratuitous. God proved his love for us by sending his Son into the world to die for our sins. We did nothing to deserve such a wondrous gift, nor could we ever offer anything of equal value in return. However, the gift does merit a *response*, and it's precisely the one that Jesus commanded. John says: "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another." As a bonus, John promises that *when* we love our neighbors, the love of God is brought to perfection in us. He says that we will become in the world as God is in heaven. In other words, we will become a true reflection of God's love in the world. By contrast, however, the one who *claims* to love God, but does not love his neighbor, is being dishonest with himself and with God.


