Mission Statement

We, the people of St. Bavo Parish are committed to be the living presence of Christ in the world today.

Empowered by the Spirit, we strive to live our shared commitment through liturgical celebrations, prayer, education, spiritual growth, bearing witness to faith and service to all.



For those who attend daily Mass or pray the Liturgy of the Hours, December 17 marks a major shift in the Advent Season. Regardless of where December 17 falls within the third week of Advent, the sequence of readings and prayers for the week is suddenly suspended, and an entirely new sequence begins. Up to this point, the Advent liturgies

have tried to maintain a healthy tension between looking back at the Incarnation and looking forward to the Final Judgment, while acknowledging that the Church and the whole Christian era exist in between those two events. It's a delicate balance, epitomized by the first Advent Preface for the Eucharistic Prayer, which is used from the beginning of Advent through December 16. It recalls how Christ assumed the lowliness of human flesh at his first coming, so that he might fulfill God's plan for human salvation, and then pivots to the Lord's second coming, when all at last will be made manifest, and all our hopes will be realized. From December 17 onward, we use the second Advent Preface, which recalls the messianic prophecies of the Old Testament, the longing of the Virgin Mary to give birth to the Savior, and John the Baptist's announcement of his arrival as an adult. In other words, the focus shifts to Jesus' presence and ministry on earth, as opposed to his first or second coming to earth.

The Gospel readings also change markedly at this time. Throughout Advent, the gospels have featured a variety of stories from Jesus' public ministry, many of them recalling signs that revealed his identity as the Messiah. On December 17, we shift to the infancy narratives in Matthew and Luke. Starting with Matthew, we read from the beginning of the gospel until just before the birth of Christ. Then we start over with Luke and do the same thing, saving Luke's account of the birth itself for Christmas Eve. The two evangelists set the stage for Jesus' arrival in very different ways. Matthew focuses on Jesus' lineage as a Son of David, while Luke emphasizes the crucial relationship between Jesus, the Messiah, and his Herald, John the Baptist.

The Liturgy of the Hours, prayed by all priests and consecrated religious, as well as quite a few lay people, also enters a new phase on December 17. The most notable change is in Evening Prayer (or "Vespers"), in the antiphons sung before the "Magnificat," Mary's famous canticle from the Gospel of Luke. The seven evenings from December 17-23, leading up to Christmas Eve, feature the "O" Antiphons. These are seven titles for Christ, which many people might recognize from the hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Each verse of that hymn is a slightly modified version of an O Antiphon. The order from the Liturgy of the Hours is as follows: O Wisdom, O Sacred Lord, O Flower of Jesse's Stem, O Key of David, O Radiant Dawn, O King of All the Nations, O Emmanuel (meaning "God with us").
