



## **Mission Statement**

We, the people of St. Bavo Parish are committed to be the living presence of Christ in the world today.

Empowered by the Spirit, we strive to live our shared commitment through liturgical celebrations, prayer, education, spiritual growth, bearing witness to faith and service to all.



The daily Mass readings begin a whole new cycle this Monday. For the next four weeks, the first readings will come from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans. At sixteen chapters, *Romans* is the longest of Paul's letters. (That is the sole reason why it appears first in the Bible.) It's also the last of his "undisputed letters" — those which were certainly authored by Paul, as opposed to a later author,

who may have ascribed his work to the famous evangelizer. Since Paul wrote this letter near the end of his missionary career, it shows a more developed theology than his earlier letters. It's also unique in another respect. Paul's other letters were written to communities that he founded, and he typically sought to address errors in their understanding or practice of the faith. Thus, he was able to address the recipients as a spiritual father offering counsel and correction to his spiritual children. Romans is different. Paul had never been to Rome, though he had long looked forward to going there. His knowledge of the Roman community came from his friends Aquila and Prisca, a Jewish couple whom he met during his missionary travels in Greece. They, and all the other Jews in Rome, had been expelled by the Emperor Claudius, leaving behind an exclusively Gentile Church where a mixed community of Jews and Gentiles had existed before. Paul's letter to this community serves as both a personal introduction and a tutorial on some key aspects of the Christian faith which he knows will be particularly relevant to them.

Paul begins by identifying himself as "a slave of Jesus Christ, called to be an Apostle and set apart for the Gospel of God." He appears to assume that the Romans already know him by reputation, so he doesn't need to go into any more detail than that. After declaring, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel," Paul then reassures the Romans, who must have been struggling to maintain their Christian faith and Christian values in the midst of a decadent and depraved society. Paul acknowledges their challenges and exhorts them to persevere in truth and good works. He also cautions them to be mindful of their own sin, and not to judge others for their shortcomings. This reminder that all are sinners will prepare the Romans for Paul's teaching about "justification by faith."

Part of laying that groundwork is emphasizing the equality of Jews and Gentiles in God's sight. God will repay each person according to his works, but not according to his fidelity to the Law of Moses. Hence, God shows no partiality between Jews and Gentiles. Furthermore, God's own righteousness has been manifested apart from the Law, through the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Paul says, "All have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God; they are justified freely by his grace through the redemption in Christ Jesus." Therefore, God does not belong to the Jews alone, but to all who believe in Christ.
