



# **Mission Statement**

We, the people of St. Bavo Parish are committed to be the living presence of Christ in the world today.

Empowered by the Spirit, we strive to live our shared commitment through liturgical celebrations, prayer, education, spiritual growth, bearing witness to faith and service to all.



Christmas is almost here! The Church is about to celebrate and *contemplate* the birth of Christ, the Savior of the world. Considering the immense importance of this event, you might expect all four gospels to provide a consistent and compelling description of what happened. They offer a fairly consistent story of Jesus' passion

and death, despite some subtle differences in how the four evangelists see Jesus. However, that is not the case with his birth. Remember, by the end of his life on earth, Jesus was a very public figure, commanding a huge amount of attention wherever he went. His every move was noted, and remembered, by many. His *birth*, by contrast, did not command nearly as much attention. In fact, it appears that the Savior of the world was born in utter obscurity and continued to live in obscurity until his baptism at about age 30.

The Gospel of Mark, the first attempt to tell the story of Jesus, doesn't even mention his birth. Mark proclaims, "Here begins the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God," and then proceeds immediately to Jesus' baptism by John. All he says about Jesus' origins is, "During that time, Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee." There's no mention of how the Incarnation came about, where Jesus was born, who his parents were, etc. Either Mark didn't know any of those details, or he didn't think them relevant to the topic of his gospel — salvation through Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Matthew and Luke both begin their gospels with "infancy narratives," which attempt to provide some context for the story of Jesus' adult life. However, they tell wildly different narratives, which conflict with each other in almost every detail. The only points on which they agree are that Jesus was miraculously conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary, that she was betrothed to a man named Joseph, who was a descendant of King David, that Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, and that he was raised in Nazareth, in Galilee. Nothing else matches up. For Luke, the home of Mary and Joseph was in Nazareth, both before and after Jesus' birth. For Matthew, they lived in Bethlehem before Jesus' birth, and remained there for a couple more years, until they were forced to flee to Egypt. Then, a few years later, when they came back to Israel, they chose to settle up north in Galilee instead of returning to Judea in the south. Interestingly, the few points on which Matthew and Luke agree seem to align perfectly with Old Testament prophesies about the birth of the Messiah.

John's gospel doesn't say anything about Jesus' birth, but it says a great deal about his origins. John's famous "Prologue" describes Jesus as the Divine Word which became flesh and dwelt among us. John doesn't really care how the Incarnation took place. What matters is that it did take place. God became human, so that human beings could be united eternally with God.
